

Disaster Classifications

Category A - Debris (loading, hauling & disposal)

Category B - Emergency Protective Measures (first 60 days)

Category C - Roads & Bridges

Category D - Water Control Facilities

Category E - Buildings & Equipment

Category F - Utilities

Category G - Parks, Recreational & Other

Why Pre-Positioned Technical Support?

- Lessoning the burden by having FEMA knowledgeable staff manage this process,
- Speeding up the cash flow by getting eligible projects processed quicker,
- Obtaining the maximum eligible value for the damage,
- Identifying hazard mitigation opportunities to minimize future impacts,
- Aiding in recovery to get the facility back to its preexisting condition and/or function faster, and
- Train and Prepare Applicant for Future Disasters.

Why Pre-Positioned Response Support?

- Enables quicker emergency response lessoning the impact on the facility,
- Pre-positioned contract allows applicant to define and manage response contractor obligations and provides cost control measures,
- Provides FEMA with documentation to enable recovery of costs to eligible scope items, and
- Can provide a mechanism for transition to recovery services.
